

SUPERINTENDENT 'S EVALUATION

Statement of Purpose:

Through evaluation of the Superintendent, the Board will strive to accomplish the following:

1. Clarify for the Superintendent his role in the school system as seen by the Board.
2. Clarify for all Board members the role of the Superintendent in the light of his job description and the immediate priorities among his responsibilities as agreed upon by the Board and the Superintendent.
3. Develop harmonious working relationships between the Board and Superintendent.
4. Provide effective administrative leadership for the school system.

Evaluation Time Frame:

The Board will provide the Superintendent with periodic opportunities to discuss Superintendent-Board relationships. A preliminary written review to take place at the 2nd regular school board meeting in October and a formal written evaluation at the 2nd regular school board meeting in February. Written notification of renewal/non-renewal must be given to the Superintendent by April 30, with nomination to the State in June.

SUPERINTENDENT'S PERFORMANCE AREAS

RELATIONSHIP WITH THE BOARD:

- Keeps Board informed consistently through oral and written communications
- Offers professional advice
- Deals with each Board member equally and without prejudice
- Refrains from public criticism of Board members
- Is knowledgeable of, adheres to, and enforces all policies and fulfills all directives of the Raymond School Board.

COMMUNITY RELATIONS:

- Receptive to input from all individuals and groups
- Works with news media effectively
- Accepts opportunities to attend or participate in community sponsored activities/ organizations
- Responds to concerns of the community

STAFF/SCHOOL RELATIONS:

- Develops sound personnel practices including but not limited to the assessment of staffing needs, nomination and assignment of staff, definition of duties and reviews the evaluations of district staff
- Promotes good morale
- Delegates responsibility/work effectively
- Deals with personnel issues impartially and objectively, within a timely manner

EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP

- Participates with community, staff, and Board and the development of educational curriculum, priorities and opportunities

BUSINESS AND FINANCE:

- Monitors the ongoing physical/financial needs of the school system
- Prepares preliminary budget for the School Board review
- Assist in identifying, planning, and implementing capital improvements

PERSONAL QUALITIES:

- Is respected in the community, schools and in education
- Works well with others
- Is suitably attired and well groomed
- Writes and speaks clearly and effectively
- Is poised in the face of crisis

BOARD GOALS AND OBJECTIVES:

- Assist the School Board in the development of attainable goals and objectives
- Develops effective programs/procedures to achieve both short and long term goals within established time frames
