ARTICLE 2— OPERATING BUDGET Shall the School District raise and appropriate as an operating budget, not including appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropriations voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the warrant, or as amended by vote of the first session, for the purposes set forth therein, totaling \$21,771,803 (Twenty One Million, Seven Hundred Seventy One Thousand, Eight Hundred Three Dollars)? Should this article be defeated, the default budget shall be \$22,144,189 (Twenty Two Million, One Hundred Forty Four Thousand, One Hundred Eighty Nine Dollars) which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the Raymond School District or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only. (This article does not include appropriations proposed under any other warrant article.) (Recommended by the School Board) (Recommended by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE 3—REA UNION CONTRACT Shall the School District vote to approve the cost items included in the collective bargaining agreement reached between the Raymond School Board and the Raymond Education Association, which calls for the following increases in salaries and benefits at the current staffing levels:

This will be accomplished by an individual/special warrant article which will take effect immediately. This is advisory only.
