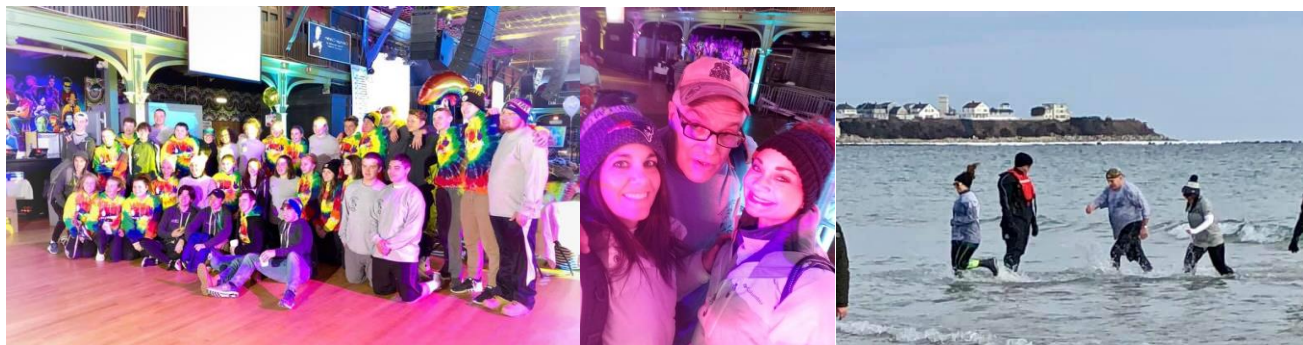

PARENTS NEEDED TO SIT ON NEASC PANEL – For the past two years, the high school community has been involved in preparing an extensive self-study demonstrating the ways in which our school is meeting the Standards for Accreditation set forth by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). An important component of the four-day visit is time designated for members of the NEASC visiting team to meet with parents to discuss the school's programs and services and learn your thoughts about your son / daughter's experiences at our school. Information gathered during those meetings will be shared with the entire visiting team and incorporated into the school's evaluation report. We need approximately 15 parent volunteers to be a part of the panel. The parent panel will meet with the visiting team on Sunday March 31st in the afternoon for approximately 45 minutes.
