
The Board has made accommodations to allow its members, guests, and the public to participate remotely.

LRES Votes on Voting Day!



As families went to the polls in Raymond on March 10th to vote, students had their own special voting to partake in. Over the past two months, 4th grade students at LRES discussed ways they wanted to improve/make things better at our school. After many discussions, the students came up with 3 changes that they would like to make at LRES. The ideas were shared out at an All School Meeting back in February. Before the vote, 4th grade students created posters and displayed them all over the school, campaigned in classrooms, and shared messages using FLIPGrid.

All of their hard work led up to voting day on Tuesday, March 10th, where a ballot box was waiting for LRES students at the voting site (IHGMS) for Raymond Citizens. Some students were able to experience voting alongside their parents, while others were able to vote the next day at school. 411 ballots casted were counted. The majority of students voted to make changes to recess! Staff will be taking the suggestions from students to improve recess for next school year.





This has been such a great experience for our entire school community. 4th grade students truly got to learn about using their voice to share ideas as well as use their persuasive words to share with students why they believed specific changes should happen at LRES. Our younger students learned what it is all about to hear ideas that are worth agreeing with and choosing between those ideas to determine what they felt was the best plan for changes to LRES next school year.

The goal of remote ELO's is to generate thought provoking journal prompts throughout the week regarding the students "new" classroom experiences. They have reflected upon such issues as the



challenges of acclimating to the unique learning environment, maintaining social relationships and what they're doing to balance fun into their schedules! Students that participate and meet all the ELO requirements until the remainder of the school year will receive .5 elective credits.

Curriculum

Congratulations to our Director of Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment, Mike Whaland! Mike recently defended his dissertation, entitled: Why Rural Teachers Stay: Examining Teacher Retention and Attrition in New Hampshire's Rural Schools

Description: 'If rural schools and communities are to be sustainable, they need to keep their teachers. This study examined teacher retention and attrition in rural New Hampshire schools. Based on the review of literature, teacher working conditions, overall job satisfaction, and

community engagement informed the conceptual framework that guided this study. This gualitative, multi case study was conducted to better understand why teachers choose to stay employed in rural New Hampshire schools, and how the state's different rural contexts influence teacher retention. The study included three schools located in different rural regions of New Hampshire. Each was considered through sampling procedures to best represent their specific rural context. A cross case analysis was conducted to account for generalizations across all contexts. Results from this study revealed insights into why teachers choose to stay employed in rural New Hampshire Schools. This study illuminated the unique sense of place of each school and how each rural context is affected by, and addresses teacher retention. These findings suggest how to effectively maintain a highly competent and



consistent teaching staff. This could prove advantageous for the continued sustainability of rural schools, rural communities, as well as the state of New Hampshire in general'.

Student Meal Online Ordering

As you may know, the Raymond School District is offering free emergency breakfast & lunch meals to students in our community during school's closure due to COVID 19. Beginning Tuesday afternoon, March 31st, we are opening up online ordering of meals for students.

If your student(s) need meals during this time and you live in Raymond, please place your order for emergency meals online by 6 AM the last "school day" before pick up day. This will help us ensure that we know how many to prepare. This means that orders for Monday pick up are needed by 6 AM



Friday, orders for Wednesday pick up are needed by 6 AM Tuesday morning.

How to place an order:

- 1. <u>Click here</u> to access our order form in MySchoolBucks.
- 2. Enter the number of meals you need along with all the students' names.
- 3. Select the day(s) you wish to pick up meals. *Note: If you select multiple days, you will need to pick up meals on each day selected. You will not be able to pick-up meals for the entire week on one day.*
- 4. Click Order Now to confirm and place your order.
- 5. Pick up your meals between 10:00 AM and Noon at Iber Holmes Gove Middle School for each day that you selected.

Ordering emergency meals online is completely free – you will <u>not</u> be charged any amount when placing an order or when you pick up your meals.

Other important information

Details on Pick up:

Please park at the curb and proceed up to pick up your grab and go bags from the table in front of the gym doors. You will be asked the names of your students to match the preorder list.

In observing good social distancing practices, kindly wait in your car until the people in

front of you finish before approaching the table.

Details on Meals:

Breakfast will consist of grains, fruit or juice and milk.

Lunch will consist of protein, grains, fruit, vegetables and milk.
