### Fourth Grade to Move to IHGMS



Fourth grade students will soon have the opportunity to attend Iber Holmes Gove! The District has carefully examined the use of classrooms across the District to make sure our learning spaces are being utilized to the maximum advantage of our students. Due to slowly declining enrollments and changes in the way students use technology, there is now ample space at IHGMS for the entire 4th grade to be comfortably educated. The classrooms available for use by students and staff at

IHGMS are spacious and filled with natural light. Classrooms for students in grades 4 and 5 will be on a different floor of the school than sixth through eighth graders, and their schedules and course offerings will differ. Much detailed planning and preparation is now underway. Our teachers, administrators and custodians will be working hard to make sure this transition is as smooth as possible. Our students deserve the best learning environments we have to offer; it's a very exciting time for the entire Raymond school community!

## **School Board Approves Several Warrant Articles**

The School Board approved several warrant articles to move forward to the Budget Committee and to the voters, including: appropriations to Capital Reserve Funds, a lease agreement for energy efficiency measures throughout the district, the placement of funds from the Town for the water pipe to a capital reserve fund, and the acceptance of one-time revenue as part of the State's adequacy aid to the District. These warrant articles will be presented to the Budget Committee on December 3rd. (See below.)



## **Presentation to Budget Committee on December 3rd**



The School Board has finalized a proposed 2020-2021 operating budget of \$26,002,674. This budget, along with the other separate and special warrant articles, will be presented to the Budget Committee on Tuesday, December 3rd at 7:00 PM in the RHS Media Center.

The heat was turned on in all the buildings in early November. We are still operating the heating systems the same as we have done in the past, utilizing night setbacks and tight schedules to ensure the most efficient use of our resources. We use a combination of sand, salt and ice melt to treat the parking lots and walking surfaces throughout the winter.



We do ask that all building users be aware of our efforts to conserve energy and do not open windows or prop doors open allowing the cold air in.

## **Cyber Safety this Season**



In the Spirit of the Holidays, here are three tips to keep you safe while shopping on Cyber Monday!

1. Make sure your browser is up to date.

Always update to the most current version of your browser. By doing this, the vulnerabilities that may have been found in previous versions are likely to have been identified and patched.

## 2. Look for HTTPS.

Before entering a credit card number, or any confidential information, make sure that the URL in your browser address bar turns green or begins with HTTPS and not HTTP. These are indicators that your session is secure and that the site is using encryption to protect your personal data. This protocol is known as SSL (Secure Sockets Layer) encryption, and it helps protect online transactions by keeping data in transit confidential through encryption, In other words, your information is encoded and not visible to hackers.

3. Learn to spot phishing attempts and questionable deals.

During the holiday season you could receive emails advertising unbelievably great deals. Beware because these could be phishing attempts, and the email's links could direct you to a bogus website built to capture personal information.

Have your guard up for emails and text messages advertising holiday deals that seem too good to be true — most likely, they are. Although spam emails can seem harmless, avoid clicking on the links and downloading files from any unknown sources. Phishing emails and websites often contain typos or spelling and grammatical mistakes. If you receive an email requesting to "verify" your confidential information, don't respond.

As the last of the colorful leaves fall and crunch beneath our feet, RHS students are being reminded of the numerous facets of high school life and the changes ahead. Reach High Scholars continue to be active in their clubs and activities, several competed in playoffs, others are busy preparing for the fall play and they all continue to do the best they can in their academic pursuits.

The fall PSAT and SAT test prep courses, sponsored by the Reach High Scholars Program led into the PSAT test for sophomores and juniors in October and SAT tests in November and December for seniors.

In recent weeks, many RHSP members have attended presentations by representatives of highly competitive colleges, organized by the RHS Guidance Office. Top colleges visiting RHS in recent years have included Hamilton, Hobart & William Smith, Holy Cross, Mt. Holyoke, St. Lawrence, Skidmore, Tufts, Washington & Lee, Wesleyan, Wheaton, and University of Rochester. Visits by these colleges is unusual for a school the size of RHS, but they have been drawn by their awareness of the rigorous initiatives of RHSP, the impressive applications they have received from our students and the number of RHSP members who have attended their colleges.

The Reach High Scholars seniors are busy completing their college applications; drafting persuasive essays, requesting recommendation letters and filing financial aid forms. Juniors and sophomores are starting to go on college trips organized by RHSP. There have been trips recently to Wheaton, Holy Cross, Bowdoin, Tufts, Saint Anselm and UNH, with several more planned for the next few months.

Reach High Scholars also are exploring summer boarding enrichment programs at Phillips Exeter, St. Paul's and Brown, with applications due for those programs over the next several weeks.

It is time for juniors to focus on the SAT test, which is an important component of the college admission process. RHSP will be sponsoring an SAT Boot Camp open to all RHS students, to occur in RAM Time starting in late January and leading into the NH Mandatory SAT test on April 14, 2020.

For those students who are not current members of RHSP but wish to be; applications have been sent out and an induction ceremony will be held on December 10<sup>th</sup>.
