The State budget impasse ended on September 24th, and New Hampshire now has a budget for the next two years. This is excellent news for our District. While we have not yet received formal documentation of anticipated revenues from the Department of Education, we expect State revenue to rise to a level similar to years past - before notable cuts were made.



We have already begun the fiscal year 2021 budgeting process. The first round of public draft budget presentations will take place on October 21st and 23rd, so please plan to attend and participate!

Bleachers at both RHS and IHGMS received accessible cutouts for wheelchair seating, as well as steps and handrails for a safer path to the seats. Many other important projects were completed as well. Our Facilities Department had a very busy summer completing contracted projects, in house projects and deep cleaning all of the buildings. At the high school, through the capital reserve fund we were able to complete two major projects. The fire alarm system was upgraded to an addressable system which included all of the devices. We were able to complete some HVAC work which affected the nurses room, main offices, and guidance office. that we worked on over the summer. We call this our Road To Learning-a sensory path.

At the elementary level, research tells us that movement helps children to be more focused and better able to maintain attention for learning. Some children need more movement than what is available to them during their classroom time. The sensory path offers opportunities for students to move. The goal of the path is for students to recognize when they need to take a break from learning and use the Road to Learning as a tool for regulation and refocus, so they can have a successful day. Teachers have taken the time to bring their classes down to explain the purpose of the path and model how it is used.

Thank you to our Occupational Therapist Sharon O'Brien and our Art teacher Michelle Munson, for painting the path. It has been a successful project. Staff and parents alike are impressed with the positive impact it has on students.


