Early Entrance into Kindergarten

Under Board Policy JEB a student may enter kindergarten if his/her chronological age is five prior to September 30 of the year entering school.

A child whose fifth birthday falls between October 1 and December 1 may be allowed to enter kindergarten if skills and maturity level strongly indicate readiness for kindergarten as determined by the Superintendent or his/her designee.

Among other things, the determination shall be based upon an assessment by the Superintendent (or designee) of the child's:

- 1. Cognitive development;
- 2. Social development;
- 3. Physical development;
- 4. Language development.

The Superintendent shall have sole discretion to determine the nature of the information used in the assessment (i.e., records, documents, interviews, etc.). In making his/her decision, the Superintendent shall also consider such factors as class size, resources, etc.. The Superintendent's decision to allow early admittance shall be final. However, a decision to deny early admittance under this policy may be appealed to the School Board for additional consideration.

The Superintendent is authorized to establish such criteria and administrative procedures as the Superintendent deems appropriate and/or necessary to implement this policy.
