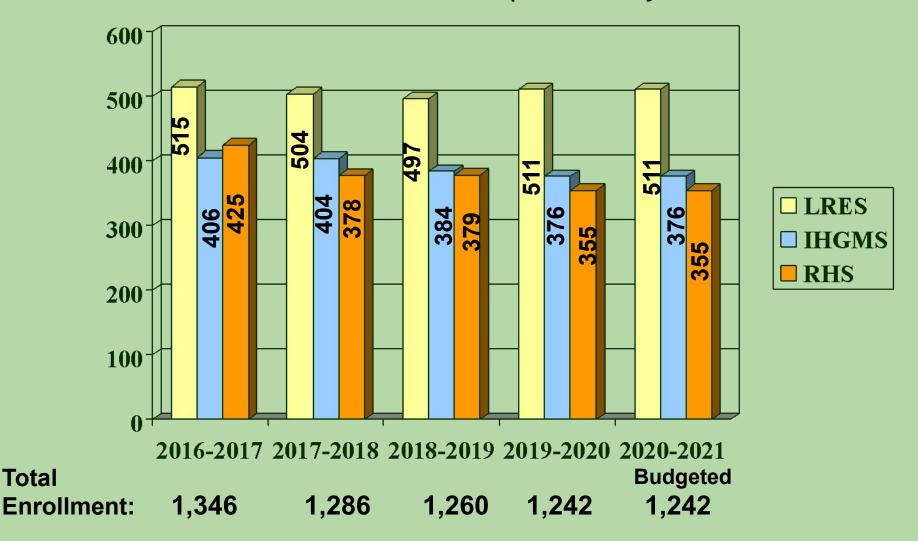

Based on October 1 enrollment figures, including students placed out of District

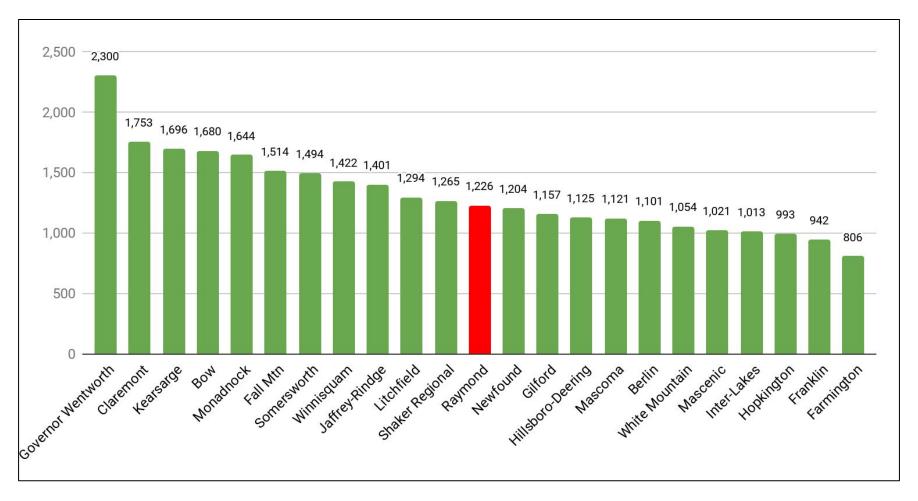

Five Year Teacher Comparison by School



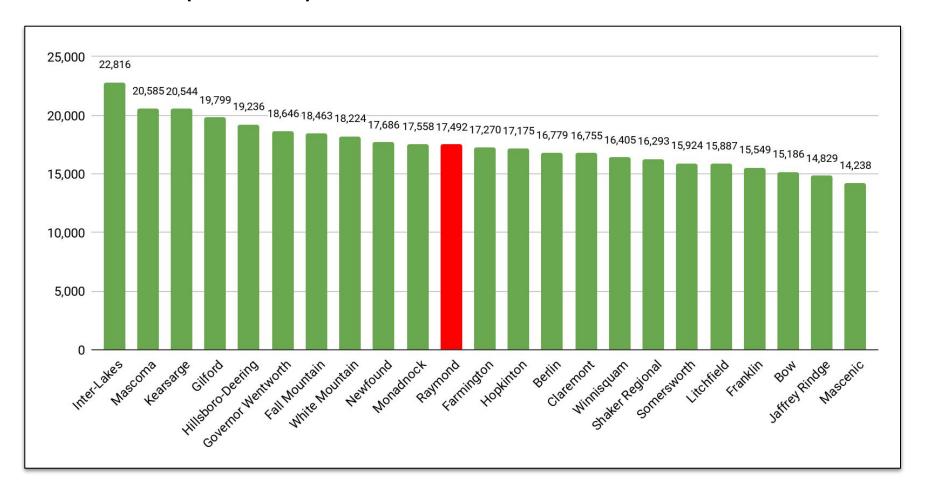

Warrant Article 2 Raymond School District Operating Budget

Shall the School District raise and appropriate as an operating budget, not including appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropriations voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the warrant, or as amended by vote of the first session, for the purposes set forth therein, totaling \$25,902,672 (twenty five million, nine hundred two thousand, six hundred seventy two dollars)?

Warrant Article 2 Raymond School District Operating Budget - Continued

Should this article be defeated, the default budget shall be \$25,674,781 (twenty five million, six hundred seventy four thousand, seven hundred eighty one dollars) which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the Raymond School District or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only. (This article does not include appropriations proposed under any other warrant article.)

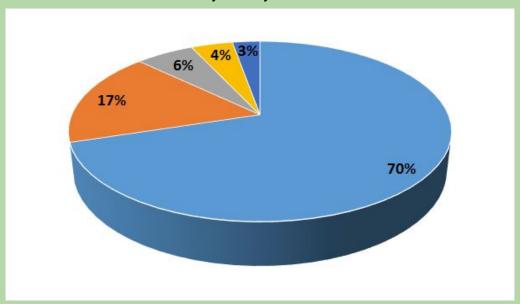

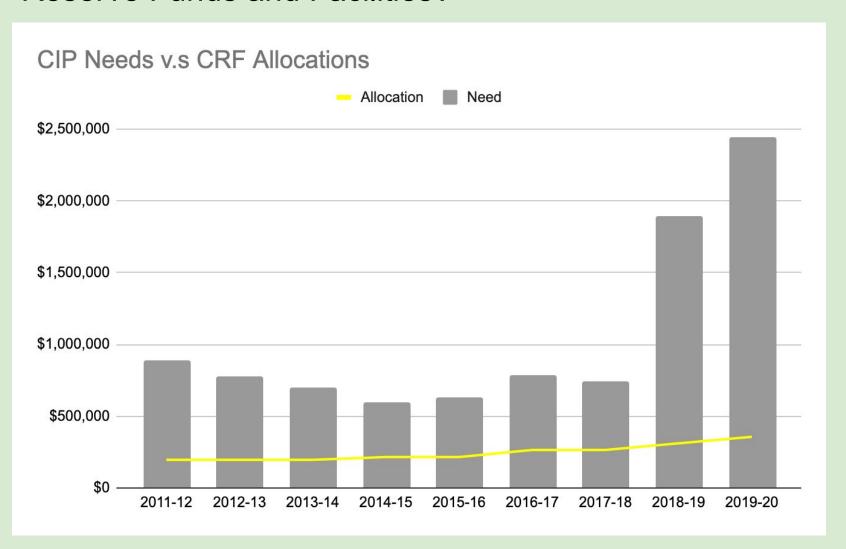

Warrant Article 3 Capital Reserve Funds

Shall the School District vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$333,076 (in total) so that the following amounts can be added to the following previously established Capital Reserve Funds in order to implement the School District's 2020-2021 Capital Improvement Program?

No tax increase, as it is the same as last year's amount.

Warrant Article 4 Equipment/Facilities Capital Reserve Fund from Surplus

Shall the School District vote to raise and appropriate up to \$75,000 (seventy five thousand dollars) to be placed in the existing Equipment, Facilities Maintenance and Replacement Capital Reserve Fund (established in 2006), with such amount to be funded from the year-end fund balance available on July 1?

(Recommended by the School Board: Yes – 5; No - 0) (Recommended by the Budget Committee: Yes – 6; No - 1)

This article asks the voters' permission for the District to save for future capital improvement projects if funds are available at the conclusion of the fiscal year. If the article passes, the Raymond School Board could vote to take up to \$75,000 of unused funds and transfer them into the Equipment, Facilities Maintenance and Replacement CRF.

No tax increase.

Warrant Article 5 Energy Efficiency

Shall the School District vote to authorize the School Board to enter into a multi- year lease purchase agreement for the installation of up to \$1,743,064 (one million seven hundred forty three thousand and sixty four dollars) of energy saving equipment and associated building and facility improvements at Raymond High School and Iber Holmes Gove Middle School, and further to raise and appropriate \$125,216 for annual lease payments to be partially offset by energy savings and a resulting reduction in costs? ...continued

Warrant Article 5 Energy Efficiency - Continued

This lease agreement will contain a non-appropriation clause. Lease payments in future years will be \$125,216, guaranteed energy savings will be \$65,738, so the estimated future budget impact, if this article passes, is \$59,478.

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(Recommended by the School Board: Yes - 5; No - 0) (Not Recommended by the Budget Committee: Yes - 3; No - 3; Abstention - 1)
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This article seeks voter approval for the District to complete necessary energy saving improvements to our middle and high schools by entering into a lease purchase agreement.

- HVAC control upgrades
- LED lighting
- Four new boilers
- Oil tank removal
- Walk-in cooler controls
- Transformers

Estimated tax impact is \$0.13 per thousand.

(Taking into account future guaranteed savings, the tax impact is estimated to be \$0.06 per thousand)

Warrant Article 6 Energy Efficiency Funds to Equipment/Facilities Capital Reserve Fund from Surplus

Shall the School District vote to raise and appropriate up to \$150,000 (one hundred and fifty thousand dollars) to be placed in the existing Equipment, Facilities Maintenance and Replacement Capital Reserve Fund (established in 2006) for the purpose of energy saving equipment and building improvements,...

Warrant Article 6 Energy Efficiency Funds to Equipment/Facilities Capital Reserve Fund from Surplus - Continued

...with such amount to be funded from the year-end undesignated fund balance available on July 1? No amount to be raised by additional taxation. This warrant article is contingent upon the passing of Article V.

(Recommended by the School Board: Yes - 5; No - 0) (Recommended by the Budget Committee: Yes – 4; No - 3)

If article 5 passes, and the District enters into a lease agreement to fund important energy saving projects across the District, this article allows the District to save money over time to pay that lease off early. If sufficient funds are available at the end of the fiscal year, the School Board can choose to allocate up to \$150,000 to the Capital Reserve Fund for that purpose. If article 5 does not pass, this article will not go into effect.

No tax increase.

Warrant Article 7 Equipment/Facilities Capital Reserve Funds from the Water Well Funds

Shall the School District vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$55,997 (fifty-five thousand, nine hundred and ninety seven dollars) to be added to the Raymond School District Equipment, Facilities Maintenance and Replacement Capital Reserve Fund (established in 2006) with this sum to come from the income generated by the water easement conveyed to the town and no amount is to be raised from taxation?

(Recommended by the School Board: Yes - 5; No - 0) (Recommended by the Budget Committee: Yes - 7; No - 0)

This article seeks to replenish the money in the Raymond School District Equipment, Facilities Maintenance and Replacement Capital Reserve Fund by putting funds that will be received from the Town of Raymond directly into that CRF. The Town of Raymond and the District have a formal agreement in place regarding the Town Well that was built on District property near Raymond High School.

To fund a portion of that project, the District used \$110,000 from the Equipment, Facilities Maintenance and Replacement Capital Reserve Fund to connect RHS to the well. The agreement in place requires the Town to reimburse the District for this expenditure over a five year period. The support of voters is needed for the District to place the funds back into the appropriate Capital Reserve Fund.

No tax impact.

Warrant Article 8 Appropriation of One-Time Funds

Shall the School District vote to raise and appropriate \$320,669 (three hundred twenty thousand, six hundred sixty nine dollars) for the purpose of school facility infrastructure projects with the sum to be offset by a one-time grant of "fiscal disparity" funds in the amount of \$320,669 as part of the State's adequacy aid to the District. No amount to be raised by additional taxation. This Article is a special warrant article.

(Recommended by the School Board: Yes - 5; No - 0) (Recommended by the Budget Committee: Yes - 5; No - 2)

The State of New Hampshire has indicated that in fiscal year 2021 (the 2020-21 school year) school districts will receive additional revenue on a 'one time' basis. This warrant article will allow the District to use the anticipated revenue for important facilities infrastructure projects that need to be done in our schools. Some examples of projects that could be funded, if this article passes, are:

- Bathroom upgrades at RHS
- Preschool playground fencing and equipment
- Bathroom and flooring upgrades at IHGMS
- Safety & security upgrades at RHS
- Water control panel upgrade at RHS
