6:30 PM <u>C. IHGMS Youth Educational Employment Service Worker</u> Discussion

During the budget development process for FY 19, a YEES Worker for IHGMS was proposed. While the Board expressed support of the position in concept, the funds were not allocated in the budget.

On July 11, 2018 the YEES worker was revisited as an agenda item at the request of the Chair. Questions about alternative funding, such as grants, donations and/or surplus options were raised.

Preliminary analysis of employee salary and benefits in mid-August revealed modest savings sufficient to consider contracting with a YEES worker if the Board collectively desires to do so. However, it is very early in the school year. If the YESS Worker is contracted, an early budget freeze may be necessary until such time that the amounts of ultimate employee salary/benefits savings become more clear.

No alternative funding is now available for the purpose of contracting with a YEES Worker for IHGMS; the YEES Worker at RHS cannot effectively support students at both IHGMS and RHS, and no other counselors in the District are able to carry out the types of duties that the YEES worker engages in (home visits before school, meet-ups during vacation weeks, etc.).

Update - Additional Info:

Janice asked for the 'amount included in the final 18-19 budget as "Lower Anticipated Salary & Benefits for Replacement Employees", so I thought that the entire Board might be interested in having this information prior to the Board meeting. <u>Please see a</u> <u>spreadsheet</u> detailing this information.

Compared to FY 18, salaries for FY 19 were reduced by \$120,000 overall in anticipation of hiring employees at lower pay rates.

The \$70,000 snapshot of savings in salaries was calculated in relation to the salary amounts budgeted for FY 19 (including the REA CBA warrant article funding). They do not represent savings in relation to the overall District budget, since there are still too many unknown factors this early in the year.

Please note that the FY 18 to FY 19 salary and benefits reductions and the current (as of last week) \$70,000 savings snapshot cannot be compared directly.
