

Grade 1, Grade 3	I really think the kids should not be forced to wear masks all day. They should be optional.
Grade 5, Grade 6	Masks should be optional for students and staff.
Grade 3, Grade 4, Grade 6	Open the school like pre Covid normal. Allow the option of full remote for people uncomfortable with regular life.

Grade 3	I would like to add some input, this school year I kept my child full time remote, we are ready to go back to school with a no mask requirement, but maybe offer Hybrid even just for 1 day temporarily for a few weeks for the kid(s) that were full time remote so kids can ease back into school full time again. Or offer half days just for a small time.
Grade 8	I do not agree with making the kids continue to wear masks all day.
Grade 1, Grade 3	Reopen with no or very minimal restrictions in distancing and optional masks. Add routine hand washing between classes, such as before/after snacks and lunches as well as classes where supplies are being shared to reduce potential contact transmission. Bring Scouts and community groups to use school facilities with no or very minimal restrictions. Continue to offer zoom conferences for Parent/Teacher meetings, continue to support Remote learning if there is a need for it, but also have it available as needed for students who have to be out of school because they are sick/unable to be in-school. Kindergarten	Thoughts for 21-22 Opening: Full-in, especially for the youngest students. Social distancing at 3 feet, as needed, but the youngest learners need to learn to work in groups and learn social norms as well. With that said, we also know the youngest students are not the ones who are having Covid symptoms. They will need to work in groups as these are fundamental skills at a fundamental age. Drop the face covering mandate. In September those who are getting vaccinated will be vaccinated. Many others have already built antibodies through exposure and/or positive tests. Especially drop the face covering mandate at recess. Let kids breathe fresh air. Let them be kids and play kid games - tag, 4-square, swings, tetherball, etc. This is so important for Social-Emotional development. The thing that upset my preschooler the most this year was that he wasn't allowed to play tag and wasn't allowed to hug his friends. Keep the sanitizing routines, the screenings, and response to illness/symptoms. The increased hand-washing has been a big part of reduced colds/illness this year. Keep reduced sharing of materials and assigned seats as much as reasonable. Do not make the Kinders eat lunch 6 feet apart. This is isolating for their little spirits. Kindergarten is an integral year in developing the Social-Emotional well being of our littles, which is proven to be a foundational building block in the individuals they become. I fear my littles Social-Emotional development much more than I fear Covid.
Kindergarten, Grade 1	If masks are on, social distancing should not be needed. Please let these little kids interact. They are being stripped of so many social learning encounters needed.

	At this point in time with all the information we have received, I find it unnecessary for children to have any type of social distancing or mask mandates. It is near impossible for kindergarten age children to not congregate in groups or keep a mask on for an extended period of time. I feel that children in this age group would be negatively impacted and their actual ability to learn impacted if these practices are implemented. The 2 or 3 children that had covid at his school during the whole time got it from older siblings and never passed it onto other classmates.
