Attorney Graham has provided some suggested wording regarding this non-binding warrant article. I've included both suggested options here - as a single warrant article and as separate but contingent warrant articles - as a starting point for School Board discussion.

Combined Article

Shall the Raymond School District vote to form a committee of seven members to be appointed by the School Board to study the possibility of the District entering a tuition agreement for Raymond High School students with ____, with the committee to report its findings to the School Board on or before December 1, 2019 ; and further, to authorize the School Board to conduct a building needs assessment and design analysis of the potential to convert and renovate Raymond High School into an elementary school; and further to raise and appropriate the sum of up to \$50,000 for the expenses of the committee and the building needs assessment?

Separate but Contingent Warrant Articles

Shall the Raymond School District vote to form a committee of seven members to be appointed by the School Board to study the possibility of the District entering a tuition agreement for Raymond High School students with ____, with the committee to report its findings to the School Board on or before December 1, 2019? This Article is contingent upon the adoption of Article ___ and will be null and void unless Article ___ is passed.

Shall the School District vote to raise and appropriate the sum of up to \$50,000 for the completion of a building needs assessment and preliminary design for the conversion and renovation of Raymond High School into an elementary school? This Article is contingent upon the adoption of Article ___ and will be null and void unless Article ___ is approved.

7:30 PM [F: Seacoast School of Technology Special Ed Tuition Charge _ _ Discussion](#)

At Seacoast School of Technology there is an additional tuition charge to Districts for every SST student with an educational disability. This year that charge is \$3,310.33 per student. This is noted on the SST budget as SPED Incremental Recent discussions at Governing Board meetings have raised questions about the fairness of that charge. Representatives from some sending Districts believe that the costs of special education services that are integrated into the SST program should simply be distributed across the tuition charges for all students.

For illustration purposes, this year we have 9 students with educational disabilities at SST for total combined surcharges of \$29,792.97. If the SPED incremental were to be spread out across all students at SST, then our share of the SPED Incremental would be \$24,254.55. Financially, that works in our favor at this time but that may not be the case every year (as numbers and ratios of enrolled students change).

From NHSBA: We have updated sample policy IJ...to more closely conform with the current provisions of Ed 306.08 Instruction Resources - including the requirement that the School Board will implement and maintain a "written plan" regarding instructional resources. We presume that most districts have plans which satisfy the plan requirements, although not necessarily linked to this policy or the NHDOE Ed. 306.08(a)(4) and (b). NHSBA adoption consideration: In order to assure compliance with the provisions of Ed. 306.08 regarding a resource plan, the Board should include a specific periodic review.

[IKFC Alternate Diploma for Students with Significant Cognitive Disabilities](#)

From NHSBA: This is a new policy intended to adopt the provisions of the federal Every Student Succeeds Act ("ESSA") which allow the awarding of a "state-defined" Alternative Diploma to certain students with the most significant cognitive disabilities.
