*This proposed policy represents the NHSBA sample policy in its entirety. From NHSBA: "This new policy is intended to reflect the provisions of RSA 189:13-a, XII which was passed into law in July 2020. Although 189:13-a, XII is part of the criminal history records check statute, it addresses different subject matter."*

[JCA Change of School Assignment Best Interest](#) (Revised)

*This proposed policy represents the NHSBA sample policy in its entirety. It merges policy JEC with JCA.*

*From NHSBA: “The old version of policy JCA concerned only reassignments based on the best interest standard, while manifest educational hardship reassignments were addressed in sample JEC. Each of the former policies reflected different processes described in RSA 193:3, I-III. 2020 legislative changes to 193:3, I-III-a (see 2020 Laws 38:22, chaptered version of 2020 HB1558, including amended HB1328) made best interest and manifest hardship processes sequential, rather than separate. Accordingly, NHSBA has merged the two processes into one policy. It is possible/likely that at some point in the next couple of years, the NH DOE will amend Rule Ed 320 to reflect the 2020 legislative changes, and such rule revisions may require additional policy revisions.”*

*Note that NHSBA has clarified that “days” in this policy refers to calendar days, not school days. If the specified date (the 10th day) falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or holiday, the next business day satisfies the requirement.*

[JEC Change of School Assignment Manifest Hardship](#) (Withdraw)

[JLCJ Concussions and Head Injuries](#) (Revised)

*Proposed policy JLCJ represents the NHSBA sample policy in its entirety. From NHSBA: “Revisions are to reflect the 2020 enactment of RSA 200:63 (see §16 of 2020 Laws Ch. 38). Paragraph I of the new law requires the N.H. Dept. of Education (“DOE”) to develop a concussion and traumatic brain injury return to learning “policy and plan” for school districts. Paragraph II requires each local school board to “adopt a concussion and traumatic brain injury return to learning policy school education program.” The DOE’s policy/plan will not be available after the beginning of 2021, but there is no delay in the mandate for local boards. While ultimately, the local policy will be informed, if not, regulated by the policy to be developed by the DOE, this revised JLCJ is intended to meet the base requirements of RSA 200:63, II.*
