

Current Grading Scales (4 pt)

Issues:

- D+ (1.2) passing
- D, D-, F (below 1.2) not passing
- The red area is confusing
- Currently students pass with a 1.2 (68%)
- IWS : Insufficient Work Shown overrides confusing
- Hard to gauge how close a student is to the next letter grade

*Course credit will be issued upon earning an overall grade of 70% or better AND a 70% or better in all competencies

**Students scoring below a 70 in one or more course competencies will receive an overall course grade in the Not Yet Competent range.

Rationale for the 70 %

- 95% of staff surveyed supported the 70%
- Students will strive for the bar that we set
- 301 students passed with a C- or better (semester 1)
- 19 students passed with a D+ (semester 1)
- State Civics Exam requirement is a 70% or better
- Supports our Core Values and Beliefs

The established minimum grade for any level of mastery at 70 is clear, meaningful, and attainable.

The % is much clearer for all

Makes it much clearer for sports eligibility
