## RHS – Special Education Programs

Connections Program - The Connections Program works with our most fragile population. Due to the level of support that these 8 students need, every student has a one-to-one paraeducator and a variety of related services (Speech, OT, PT, Reading).

REAP (Raymond Experiential Alternative Program) - There are 12 students (7 students are part of special education) that participate in the programming. A major component is the adventure based counseling that happens throughout the course of the year. This is in place in order to reconnect them to the school and their education.

TLC (The Learning Center) - The Learning Center focuses on the specialized instruction for 53 students. All of these students are in need of very specific instruction that will allow them to access the curriculum like every other student.


