Updates	4th - We are looping up to 5th grade! 5th - We are looping down to the 4th grade! We are prepping for Nature's Classroom! 6th - We are using Advisory time to address behavior such as appropriate hallway, lunchroom, and recess behaviors. 7th - Assisting with hallway transitions during lunchtime to help combat the challenging behaviors we are facing when students are moving in the hallways. 8th - Preparations for the DC trip are ramping up as the trip moves closer. School-Wide - Reading Specialist position is being filled this evening. Interviews are in process for PE, Art, and 5th grade. Waiting on applicants for Foreign Language. Title 1- The after-school program is up and running until June 3rd, providing small group reading and/or math instruction to qualifying students. Master Schedule - The leadership team is working on potential adjustments to the master schedule to better meet the needs of our students and to attempt to address some of the challenges we have experienced this year related to ongoing staffing shortages. Parent/Teacher Conferences - The spring parent teacher conferences have been held. The turn out was lower than expected and there were plenty of appointments available.						

Teacher Openings - For next year 5th grade special education and speech specialist positions have been held. We have finalists for the art and 5th grade position. Interviews are just beginning for PE. We do not have any

certified applicants for foreign languages yet.

# 4th - Significant amount of teaching students remotely and in person at the same time, staff shortages resulting in everyone doing more

5th - Inconsistent recess coverage results in students coming in with lots of issues that take class time to deal with. Staffing shortages are to blame.

6th - Staffing shortages and paras being pulled are leading to increased discipline problems.

7th - No paras in 7th grade. Limited and inconsistent staff is causing an increase in students struggling with their work as well as an increase in behavior issues. Student attendance continues to be a concern.

8th - Lack of para support puts strains on case managers and teachers.

School-Wide - The staffing shortage continues to have serious ripple effects throughout the school from insufficient IEP support to inconsistent reinforcement of expectations during non-academic times. The MS leadership team is working on developing solutions from a master schedule perspective.
