Raymond School District Policy – JFAA-R*

ADMISSION OF RESIDENT STUDENTS

FOR REDACTION

It is the policy of the Raymond School Board to accept as a resident student any student who fits into any one of the following categories per RSA 193:12:

- 1. The student lives with a parent or legal guardian in the Raymond School District; or,
- 2. If the parents live apart and are not divorced, legal residence is the residence of the parent with whom the child resides; or,
- 3. In a divorce decree where parents are awarded joint legal custody, the legal residence of a minor child is the residence of the parent with whom the child resides; or,
- 4. If the minor is in the custody of a legal guardian appointed by a New Hampshire court of competent jurisdiction or a court of competent jurisdiction in another state, territory, or country, legal residence is where the guardian resides; or,
- 5. The student lives within the boundaries of the District, but does not live with a parent or legal guardian and has reached the age of majority; or,
- 6. The student lives outside the boundaries of the District, but has a parent or legal guardian who resides within the boundaries of the District. If the student lives outside of the boundaries of the District, the student must be a senior at Raymond High School to qualify. Further, the student must present a case of hardship as determined by the Superintendent of Schools. If the student lives outside of the boundaries of the District and is permitted to attend Raymond High School by the Superintendent, the Superintendent shall notify the School Board of his/her decision.
- 7. Any case not falling into any of the above categories will be referred to the School Board for a decision.

Children entering school for the first time must have proof of physical examination, immunization records, a copy of the child's birth certificate, and proof of residency satisfactory to the Superintendent or his/her designee. Principals or their designees will meet with new children and parents and explain school programs.
