<p align="center">Updates</p>	<p>First trimester of full implementation of the Lucy Calkins Writing program. The feedback from teachers is positive and they are seeing great improvement in student writing.</p> <p>We have 14 teachers participating in an on-site UNH Writing course. This course supports our implementation of the Lucy Calkins Units of study for writing and best instructional practices for teaching writing.</p> <p>We have had a successful first trimester of SEL groups with our K-4 students. The instructional focus has been the "Zones of Regulation", students being "SuperFlex", and mindfulness strategies for students.</p>

	<p>The admin team has been collaborating with Scott Riddell and the preschool teachers to review our current preschool program. We sent out a survey to current preschool parents as well as posted the survey on our FB page and school website- to gather feedback from the community.</p> <p>We continue to work on aligning our current curriculum and units of instruction with the competencies. This includes timelines by trimester and the development of common summative assessments and rubrics aligned to assessments.</p>
