Grade Level/Team Highlights

Kindergarten - Kindergarteners have been working hard on learning how to be a part of a classroom community. We have been building on these skills each and every day. We have been learning letter names and sounds using our FUNdations program, and have been learning all about numbers using Math in Focus and Guided Math. Kindergarteners are not only able to use hands on manipulatives this year, but they are able to do so in groups. Being able to do this has allowed for collaboration with other students. It has also allowed for growth both socially and academically. We are learning how to become authors of our own books, and are slowly learning to stretch out sounds to write words of our own.

Highlights

First Grade- First grade is so excited to be learning in person full time this year. We are learning about number sense, addition and subtraction, making sentences, writing personal narratives, parts of a story, and nouns and verbs. In addition, we are learning to read and write using our Fundations curriculum and small group reading instruction. Two first grade classes are learning in a multi-age setting and several others are working with other first grade classes during the day. We are looking forward to our first field trip to the SEE Science Center in January!

Second Grade - Nothing beats working side by side, collaborating in small groups, or whole class discussions to spark new ideas or deepen our learning! Since September, second graders have been immersed in building community. Together they have formed rules to work and play by. They are assigned jobs to make their classrooms run smoothly. Since exploring communities during social studies, their definition of community expanded when they realized how many communities they belong to including their family, school, and town.

The focus in math has been reading, writing, and representing numbers to 1,000 in various ways: using base ten blocks, writing the standard, expanded, and word form of a number.

Writing personal narratives helps us to get to know one another when it's our turn to share.

Third Grade- Third graders were happy to start the year in person with all their classmates! We have been learning about place value, addition, sentence types, writing personal narratives, and learning about weather. Students took a trip to Mt. Agamenticus to learn about Leave No Trace and to practice reading maps and using compasses. Third graders are also participating in mixed class Fundations groups to help build their reading skills based on their individual needs.
