	Grade Level/Team Highlights
	Kindergarten students have been busy working on their force and motion unit in science! They have been using K'nex pieces to build ramps, and swings. They are using what they have learned about force and motion to put these simple machines to work. For St. Patrick's day, students created leprechaun traps and participated in other fun St. Paddy's themed activities during small group time. For the weather unit, students had a virtual visit from Kevin Scaruppa! Kindergarteners also started to learn about digraph sounds. Digraph sounds will now be incorporated into our daily fundations lessons, as well as in small group activities. In math, they have started our unit on both 2D and 3D shapes and are incorporating positional words.
Highlights	First graders have learned all about patterns in the sky involving night and day, the sun, moon, stars, and constellations. In math, students are learning the values of coins, adding coins, and ultimately creating their own "stores" in our classrooms. They are learning the values of digits up to 120 as well as word problems with addition and subtraction. In our Fundations program we are starting to work with consonant blends and practicing it in our writing. Students are finishing up on an opinion writing unit and will soon begin informational writing about animals!
	Second graders have discovered that matter is found everywhere you look. They have been looking and testing the properties of the three states of matter - solids, liquids, and gasses. One particular challenge that students participated in was designing a hat to keep the sun off of them given a specific, yet limited list of materials. The properties of each material determined its essential use for their hat. Students were quite inventive. Addition and subtraction with regrouping was the focus in math moving from a hands on approach to pictures to the traditional algorithm. The study of prefixes and suffixes in Fundations will keep us moving forward in reading and writing.
	Third grade has been busy working on multiplication! They are working towards building their fact fluency. They are learning that multiplication is repeated addition, and can be modeled by groups, arrays, and area models and the connection with families with division. Third graders are finishing their informational writing pieces and moving into trying to convince others of their opinions!
	UA- In PE students have been working on and improving their sportsmanship skills. We are currently moving into more "team" oriented games. They are learning the importance of working together as a group, but also respecting other teams and their accomplishments. In the Library, students are continuing to explore types of books and are working on being flexible thinkers and problem solvers with a variety of STEM tasks and book extensions. In music, students have been working on rhythm, melody, tempo and dynamics by playing various rhythm instruments, creatively moving to music and singing. The 3rd graders also have begun a recorder unit. In Health-Science, students have been learning now we can further help our school to be a safe and respectful place, with a focus on bullying prevention. In Art, Kindergarten and second graders are learning about abstract art, First grade is

	painting with watercolor and oil pastel, and third graders finished painting their color wheels and complimentary colors art project.
