7:20 PM D. Full-Time Reopening of School ______Action

The District's Reopening Plan was last reviewed and approved by the Board on the 17th of February. Because circumstances are changing rapidly, the Chair of the Board requested a review of the plan again determine if, when, and under what circumstances it will be feasible for students to safely return to full time, on-site schooling.

At this time (3/12/21) the level of community transmission in the State, and in the the community of Raymond, is categorized as substantial. Cases of COVID-19 in New Hampshire are trending downward, but the rate of new cases remains higher than last spring, summer or early fall (prior to November 11, 2020).

Raymond High School has been designated as a mobile vaccination site, and we estimate that all school personnel will have the opportunity to be fully vaccinated by April 15th. Post vaccination guidelines are preliminary, but can be found <u>here</u>. I have also included some vaccination <u>FAQ information for school personnel</u> for your perusal.

Raymond School District Reopening Plan

Key to a full return to school are social distancing requirements. For your review, I have included guidelines for social distancing as provided by the State as well as information about room capacity for each of our schools.

<u>NH DOE K-12 Back to School Guidance</u> (social distancing info highlighted on p. 8-10)

A review of our classrooms and current hybrid enrollments illustrates that if 3 foot social distancing were in place, some of our classroom configurations/furniture would need to be adjusted in order to accommodate all hybrid students simultaneously while maintaining 3 feet between student seats. However, the situation would be manageable to address using existing resources.

Two of the most salient challenges of a full reopening this spring would be busing and cafeteria use. While we could encourage parents to drive their children if possible, we cannot ensure that students on buses would remain 3 feet apart if all hybrid students return to school full time. Also, our cafeterias would need to be supplemented by the use of other areas to allow us to require 6 feet of social distancing when students are eating or drinking (masks not in use). The District could consider the use of outdoor seating for this purpose (and other uses).

A return to full time, on-site learning is important for the academic, social and emotional development of our students. The District is eager to make this transition in a way that protects the health and safety of every member of our school community. The REA has expressed their position that members should be fully vaccinated before our schools reopen to full time on-site education.

In order to ease the transition of students back to school next year, the District will be offering a range of summer programming opportunities for students, intended to remediate and accelerate learning as well as provide opportunities for transition and socialization. A brief outline of these, along with dates, <u>can be found here</u>.

Our current Policies do not specifically allow for Raymond resident students who attend charter schools or private schools to participate in State or district wide assessments in our district, although home education students do have that right. Given that this is an atypical year, with reduced opportunities for students across the State, we ask the Board to consider waiving this Policy for the current school year to allow students who reside in Raymond but attend private or charter schools to participate our in State or district assessments given a written request from a parent or guardian.
