*This time is allotted to review and discuss plans and recommendations related to the potential full reopening of school on May 3, 2021. The administration is eager for all students to have the opportunity to return to full time on-site education, while retaining the parent/guardian choice for remote education. The health and safety of all involved is at the forefront of all planning efforts. A full reopening will include some salient challenges. Most notably:*

- *Social distancing of 3 feet cannot be maintained consistently on buses.*
- *As more students use private transportation, traffic on roads by LRES and IHGMS will be adversely impacted at drop off and pick up time.*
- *On-site student screenings will be more time consuming.*
- *All teachers will need to be prepared to simultaneously teach both on-site and remote students.*
- *Some activities currently scheduled on Fridays will be cancelled or rescheduled to after school (Ex. middle school band and chorus).*

*The updated draft plan is based on new guidance from the NH Department of Health and Human Services in the context of the District's tentative target of fully reopening schools on May 3, 2021.*
