While we are pleased with the initial feedback we have received, we eagerly await their final report, as this will serve as a blueprint for school improvement.</p> <p>*Penguin Plunge: Bill Hayes organized over a hundred students and staff to participate in the Special Olympics' Penguin Plunge.
