

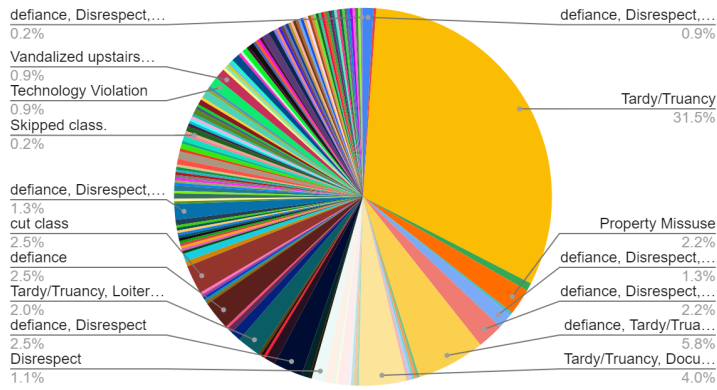
Principal's Quarter Report to the Raymond School Board
