Unified Arts:

Robotics students that participated in a statewide robotics competition took both 1st & 2nd place! CAD created some amazing prints throughout the year with custom designed key chains and boxes with lids reinforcing algebraic & geometric concepts while learning a professional design program: Fusion360.

Digital Components and Research students improved their ability to adjust settings in email, calendar, and drive. Their main focus was learning how to analyze data using spreadsheets, writing formulas, logic statements and implementing conditional formatting. Programming students completed a variety of programs, including one where they learned how to verify if a password was valid or not.

All Computer classes completed units in cybersecurity that introduced basic networking, passphrase generation, basic coding and encryption, along with awareness of digital threats and how to protect against them.

Raymond High School Music Department was granted a Tri-M Music Honor Society by the National Association for Music Education (NAfME). Local Chapter 9313 inducted its first ever members in a ceremony during this Spring's first ever HONORS Concert: Caitlyn Fournier '23, Jack Harmon "24, Anna Karcz '25 are Raymond High Scholl's first ever inductees.

Extended Learning Opportunity Students availed themselves of opportunities to assist with their career pathways.

82 students explored an ELO this year, 9 off-site career exploration field trips, 45 professional guests visited during RAM and students attended an onsite job fair which included over 25 business vendors.
