2022-2023, Quarterly Report, June 21, 2023

Highlights	<p>Unified Arts: <i>Robotics</i> students that participated in a statewide robotics competition took both 1st & 2nd place! <i>CAD</i> created some amazing prints throughout the year with custom designed key chains and boxes with lids reinforcing algebraic & geometric concepts while learning a professional design program: Fusion360.</p> <p><i>Digital Components and Research</i> students improved their ability to adjust settings in email, calendar, and drive. Their main focus was learning how to analyze data using spreadsheets, writing formulas, logic statements and implementing conditional formatting. Programming students completed a variety of programs, including one where they learned how to verify if a password was valid or not.</p> <p><i>All Computer classes</i> completed units in cybersecurity that introduced basic networking, passphrase generation, basic coding and encryption, along with awareness of digital threats and how to protect against them.</p> <p><i>Raymond High School Music Department</i> was granted a Tri-M Music Honor Society by the National Association for Music Education (NAfME). Local Chapter 9313 inducted its first ever members in a ceremony during this Spring's first ever HONORS Concert: <i>Caitlyn Fournier '23, Jack Harmon '24, Anna Karcz '25 are Raymond High Scholl's first ever inductees.</i></p> <p><i>Extended Learning Opportunity</i> Students availed themselves of opportunities to assist with their career pathways. 82 students explored an ELO this year, 9 off-site career exploration field trips, 45 professional guests visited during RAM and students attended an onsite job fair which included over 25 business vendors.</p> <p><i>Pre-School</i> had their end of the year celebrations 6/14/2023 Families were able to attend and have a picnic snack with their preschool kiddos. The afternoon class did a wonderful job singing their songs and both classes have shown so much growth in their early learning skills this year!</p> <p><i>Afternoon preschoolers</i> had their mini field trip to LRES on 6/12/2023. They were able to tour the school, see their future kindergarten classrooms, and meet the teachers. We also were invited to stop in and see some of the UA teachers and their classes in action! Preschool thanks Mrs. Yacek and Mrs. Franchini for escorting us around the building!</p> <p>Students in our <i>Connections Program</i> were able to engage with the community at 13 different places. We learned different skills on being out in the community, and were able to practice them extensively.</p> <p>Class of 2023 - ALL of our Class of 2023 students graduated!</p>
