We continue to also report out on course competencies and work-study practices in addition to course grades. *YRBS: Students took the Youth Risk and Behavior Survey on Tuesday, March 22. The YRBS is a national survey, conducted every two years among 9th through 12th grade students. The survey monitors six types of health-risk behaviors that contribute to the leading causes of death and disability among youth and adults, including: Behaviors that contribute to unintentional injuries and violence Sexual behaviors that contribute to unintended pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases, including HIV infection Alcohol and other drug use Tobacco use Unhealthy dietary behaviors Inadequate physical activity *COLLEGE BOARD: Our College Board testing day went off without a hitch. Freshman took the PSAT 8/9, sophomores took the PSAT 10, and juniors took the SAT. I want to thank our Meredith Hallman and the rest of the RHS School Counseling Office for their work in making the day run smoothly.
