I would like to take this moment to thank the parents and guardians of Raymond for their support as we continue to move forward this year. I recognize as a school district we might forget the impact the last few years have had on parents and guardians. You have endured schools being closed, remote and hybrid learning, and this year a full return to the classroom. Our full return to the classroom brought new challenges for you as we attempt to balance the educational needs of your children with the health needs of students and staff. Again, I appreciate your efforts in working with us through the process.

I now have to ask you to make another adjustment to your schedules as we move forward with a 'Booster Day' for Friday November 19th. We have planned a scheduled early release for that day which will provide an opportunity for our staff to receive their booster shot. Student Meals on the November 19th Half Day

The upcoming early release day on Friday, November 19 th creates a change in our meals for the day. They will still, of course, be free to students!

~On that day only, there will be no breakfast served at LRES or IHGMS, but rather BRUNCH for early LUNCH will be served in the cafeterias on the schedule published by each school.



~At RHS meals will run as they do on a Midterm or Finals day. The New Wave Deli will be open for breakfast as usual and throughout the morning, with the meal turning over to

lunch availability as of 10:30. Sandwiches and salads must be pre-ordered in the morning if desired. The hot dog meal as posted will still be served on the main side as of 10:30 "To-Go" packaging will be used at both stations for ease of grab and go meals!

Surveillance and Rapid COVID-19 Testing in Schools - Consent Forms



Raymond School District has partnered with ConvenientMD Urgent Care to provide COVID-19 testing within the district. We are offering two distinct testing programs; surveillance testing as well as rapid testing staff and students who become symptomatic during the school day. Each testing option will require a consent form signed by a parent/guardian or the individual being tested if over 18 years of age. Those interested in participating in both programs will need separate consent for each. Testing will be provided at no cost to staff and students.

Surveillance Testing:

Surveillance testing is designed to detect asymptomatic cases of COVID 19. It is an
additional layer of protection within our district to mitigate the spread of COVID 19
within our school buildings. Participants will be tested on a routine basis (at
minimum monthly). The frequency and testing dates will be communicated out by
each school building. Please see the <u>ConvenientMD SASS Flyer</u> to learn more.

Rapid Testing:

Testing is available to staff and students specifically if they become symptomatic
while they are in the building. Staff and students should not be sent to school in
order to receive testing. If the test is negative and symptoms are mild as
determined by the nurse, the individual may be allowed to remain in the building.
Staff and students may be excluded from school even if they have a negative
COVID test at the discretion of the school nurse.

Both testing programs are nasal swabs and not nasopharyngeal (meaning, that swabs are gently inserted approximately ¾'s of an inch into the nose). No testing will be administered to any individual without a signed consent form. Please reach out to your school nurse should you have any additional questions.

Apprenticeship Programs/Trades:

Some of the experiential learning opportunities students are exploring are in the fields of Cosmetology, Welding, Education, Sea Cadets (Military), Automotive, Leadership, Animal Sciences, Human Services, Music and Cinematography.

Workforce to Learn Grant Funded Program:

This year, RHS will be collaborating with Palmer and Sicard Inc. Construction and Jewell Instruments. The work based learning with Jewell Instruments is an

opportunity for a student to learn the skills of a Calibration Tester. This would be of interest to a student who likes to take apart and rebuild appliances or electronics.
