Be Prepared to Receive Important Notifications

It's that time of year when we test our emergency notification system to make sure that messages are reaching all those who need to know about school closures, delays, unanticipated early releases or other emergency situations.



Parents/guardians should expect to receive a test message on the evening of Monday, October 3rd. Those who do not receive

the message should first check to be sure that the required annual student registration was fully completed and that accurate contact information is in that system. If the registration is complete and accurate, but the message was not received, parents/guardians should call the school where the child attends to report the problem. This will allow us to make sure our system is working smoothly so that all will receive important notifications when needed.

From Reach High Scholars - College Visits



Fall is a terrific time for seniors and even juniors to hit the road and see college campuses, which have come alive after the summer break. RHSP strongly encourages students and families to see colleges in person whenever possible. It remains the best way to experience a school's resources, facilities, and community for yourself. The virtual options can be used as a supplement. They are particularly valuable for a student considering a college beyond a reasonable overnight trip from

home and to delve further in depth for information on colleges previously visited.

Most colleges require online pre-registration for both in-person and virtual information sessions and tours. For in-person options in particular, spots are limited and may fill quickly, so plan ahead! A quick strategy is to align trips with days that Raymond High School is not in session, allowing for visits without missing class time. The registration process is not lengthy or difficult, and may be accomplished by visiting individual college websites; do pay special attention to colleges which may still be requiring masks and/or proof of Covid vaccination in order to participate.

The Reach High Scholars website (www.reachhighscholars.org) can be a wonderful resource throughout this process. There, you will find lists of highly resourced colleges which combine an excellent education with robust endowments that allow for generous financial aid awards—these schools are the recommended starting point. RHSP advises student members to try to see 15-20 schools in person or virtually, with the goal of eventually applying to 8-10.

You will also find suggestions of schools that are a daytrip from Raymond, along with ideas for combining them in ways that make sense logistically and maximize the limited time you have. Links to virtual offerings are provided, for those cases in which it may not be practical to see a particular school in person.
