School & Community

Raymond, NH is a rural town with a population of approximately 12,000 residents. It is located 20 miles from Manchester, NH, 30 miles from the seacoast, and 70 miles from Boston, MA.

Raymond High School is a four-year public comprehensive high school. The faculty consists of 40 faculty, 2 counselors, 3 administrators, and 20 support staff. The school population is 346 students: 66 seniors, 62 juniors, 113 sophomores, and 105 freshmen. The student body is predominantly white with 2.3% African-American, 1% asian, 2% hispanic, and less than 1% native American.

Raymond High School Mission

The responsibility of education is shared among parents, students, faculty, staff, administrators, and community members. We recognize each individual's unique needs and learning styles, and provide challenging learning opportunities in a supportive and safe environment. Diploma Requirements

Standard Diploma

The standard diploma requires students to complete 24 credits in the following areas:

English	4 credits
Math	3 credits
Social Studies	2.5 credits
Science	3 credits
Arts	0.5 credits
Health	0.5 credits
Computer Education	1 credit
Physical Education	1 credit
Electives	8.5 credits

Honors Diploma

The honors diploma requires students to complete 28 credits and a minimum GPA of 3.27. All the standard diploma requirements must be met plus 2 consecutive years of a world language, and either an ELO or online course.

Curriculum & Grading

Credits

The school year is made up of 2 semesters with 4 marking quarters. The average class size is seventeen students. Full year courses earn 1 credit and semester courses earn .50 credit. Students must earn a D+ to be awarded credit. The Principal's List consists of students who earn an "A" in all courses.

The Honors List consists of students earning grades of "B" or better in all courses.

GPA and Class Rank

GPA and Class Rank are calculated using a weighted average on a Raymond High School calculates a weighted GPA on a 4 scale with honors courses receiving an additional point and AP courses an additional 2 points. Raymond High School uses a weighted class rank. The weighted class rank is based on the average of all courses. Valedictorian/Salutatorian determination will be made after 4th quarter report cards.

Curriculum Offerings

Honors courses are offered in English, Mathematics, Social Studies, and Science. Advanced Placement courses: English Literature, English Language, Calculus AB, US History, Government, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and Computer Science. Dual Enrollment courses: Quantitative Reasoning

Seacoast School of Technology

Students can elect to attend up to a 2 year course of study. Programs include Animal and Plant Science, Automotive Technologies, Biotechnology, Building Construction Technologies, Computer Programming, Culinary Arts, Digital Media Arts, Careers in Education,, Health Science Technologies, Marketing Technologies, Pre-Engineering, and Welding Technologies.

NH Scholars

The New Hampshire Scholars Initiative is focused on increasing the number of high school students who take a rigorous secondary level curriculum designed to strengthen college success.

VLACS

Virtual Learning Academy Charter School is a free online charter school available to all NH students. Raymond has many students who enroll to explore unique opportunities not offered at RHS.

Reach High Scholars

The Reach High Scholars Program (RHSP) offers a continuum of initiatives starting with Raymond Roundtables, a summer academic enrichment for 7th, 8th and 9th graders, based on the Harkness method of teaching. During high school summers, RHSP members attend summer academic enrichment programs at major institutions, including Brown University, Phillips Exeter Academy and St. Paul's School. RHSP conducts PSAT and SAT prep courses that are more extensive than those normally available in high schools.
